Tuesday 20th to Thursday 22nd June

Southwold on the Suffolk coast will take you back to the nostalgic era of family holidays in the 1950's. Beach huts, afternoon tea, buckets and spades and walks along the Pier. Fishing boats still arrive back in back in harbour and sell their catch from sheds whilst children delight in crab fishing along the wharf side.

The town is a real delight with both a lighthouse and brewery, in the middle of the town. The Adnams family have owned and run the brewery for 145 years and a visit and tour of the brewery is highly recommended. Gin drinkers will be delighted to hear that they have a distillery producing a range of highly rated products and now we are all at a qualifying age should contemplate sampling the 48% proof 'Death's Door' gin! The high street is full of independent shops with hardly a multiple store in sight and in summer a live theatre with excellent productions has a full changing programme throughout the summer.

The harbour is in the River Blyth just to the south of the town and has recently been upgraded with a new floating pontoon which we have reserved in advance for OW yachts. It is equipped with water and electricity with showers and facilities available in the Harbour Masters office.

A Guide to Southwold and the Surrounding Area

Just walking around Southwold is a delight with its independent shops, book stores, coffee shops and restaurants. Following is a list of some of the attractions worth visiting:

Southwold Pier: Britain's only 21st century pier with restaurant, café, unusual amusement arcade, water clock and 'wacky walk of mirrors'.

Southwold Lighthouse: A Trinity House operating lighthouse positioned in the middle of the town and open to visitors.

The Alfred Cory Museum: The former Cromer lifeboat shed, now home to an historic Southwold lifeboat.

Buckenham Galleries: One of East Anglia's premier contemporary galleries showing a wide selection of paintings, ceramics, jewellery, sculpture, glass work and bespoke furnature.

Southwold Museum: Dutch gabled cottage with many exhibits of local interest.

The Sailor's Reading Room: Built in 1864 for fisherman and mariners as an endeavour to keep them out of the many local pubs. Nautical exhibits line the walls and fill glass cabinets. Pictures and portraits of local fishermen and seascapes, model ships and maritime paraphernalia offer a fascinating history of Southwold's connections with the sea.

Snape Maltings: The home of the Aldeborough Festival, the complex of buildings houses not only one of the country's leading concert venues but also a range of independent artisan shops providing a thoroughly different experience to shopping on the high street. Artworks and sculptures adorn the reed walks by the riverside surrounding the Maltings.

Orford Castle and Village: The castle is one of England's most complete and unusual keeps and is remarkably intact allowing visitors to explore from the basement, through the lower and upper halls to the roof where there are magnificent views seaward to Orford Ness. Managed by English Heritage

Sutton Hoo, near Woodbridge: The 7th century burial ground of a Saxon king complete with a ghost ship and a remarkable treasure trove. Managed by National Trust.
